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BEA Announces the 2015 "Best of Festival" King Foundation Awards and BEA Festival of Media Arts Award Winners

Washington, D.C. – Seventeen faculty and student works have been chosen to receive the BEA Best of Festival King Foundation Awards – the top awards given during BEA's Festival of Media Arts, a competitive festival open to BEA faculty and student members.
